What have the Governors ever done for us?

It's a fair question which we want to answer more clearly. As Governors, we have the same shared goals as the rest of the school. We work with the headteacher and SLT to set the ethos, vision and strategic direction, and have a balancing role to monitor the financial management and educational performance of the school.

Governors are 'critical friends', asking questions to support and challenge at all levels so that the school can be the best it can be. Governors are more than just enthusiasts for an excellent education. We have a wide range of skills and must be curious, collaborative and committed; prepared to challenge appropriately and to keep the school's wider purpose at the heart of conversations.

This term, most Governors spent an intense and productive morning visiting the school in action. It may be known as **'Governor Day'**, but the focus is squarely on what we see across the school – engaged students and committed staff. It enabled us to have fruitful conversations with students and staff, prompt improvements and celebrate success.

It was an important chance to listen directly to staff, opening up honest conversations about the longterm strategy of the school, importance of improved communication, workload, staff wellbeing and career development. We heard more about the research which staff are leading, including projects on environmental sustainability and on supporting neurodiverse students.

It was a privilege for Governors to hear directly from students, who were bold and articulate in their feedback. With students from Year 7 to Sixth Form, we explored how school policies are working in practice, and explored important issues of inclusion, drugs education and misogyny.

We looked at how staff are embedding creativity and innovation in all subjects across the curriculum and how great strides are being made in the development of a Super Curriculum and the KnatchBacc for next year. Personal Development is at the heart of creating a culture of inclusion at the school, so we looked at both how this is woven in through lessons and cross-curricular activities, and what the reality of Student Support looks like in practice. We reviewed the recent Parent Survey results which reflected the high importance that parents place on this.

Thank you to all the students and staff as ever for making us all so welcome. It was an inspiring and thought-provoking morning and sets the scene for a positive year ahead.

As a Senior Lecturer in Business Management at Ravensbourne University London, Vivian is positioned at the nexus of London's dynamic design ecosystem in delivering modules for undergraduate and postgraduate students in Project Management, Leadership and Work-Based Learning.

Vivian's academic journey is marked by a rich tapestry of qualifications, including a PhD in Quality Management; two Masters degrees in Engineering and International Economic Law from the University of Warwick, as well as a Master's degree in Management from the University of Bath; complemented by a Bachelor's degree in Economics with a minor in Anthropology from the University of Virginia.

Her work in transforming professional learning through the arts has benefited organisations such as UBS, Nomura, AIA, Siemens, Perrier-Jouët, and the Hilton Group, evidencing her role as a bridge between artistic creativity and business innovation.

Vivian is the British Council's Alumni UK Regional Ambassador for Northeast Asia, a Member of the Court at the University of Bath and a Trustee of Engage (National Association of Gallery Education) and is currently in the process of co-authoring a book on the application of Artificial Intelligence in Creative Industries slated for publication in 2024.
